Great Lent and Holy Week

Great Lent began on Monday, March 3. The Eastern Orthodox Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 13 and Easter / Holy Pascha will be celebrated on Sunday, April 20. The Palm Sunday Divine Liturgy will be held at 10:30 a.m. Blessed palms will be distributed at the conclusion of the service. There will be no services on Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, Holy Wednesday, Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday. The sanctuary will be open from 5:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. on those days.

Father Peter Irfan will be traveling from Buffalo, New York, and he will be conducting services only on Palm Sunday and Pascha / Easter. There will be an abbreviated Lamentations Services on Holy Friday, April 18 at 6:00 p.m. This will be led by the members of congregation. At the conclusion of the service flowers will be distributed to those present. The service will last about 45 minutes and should conclude by 6:45 p.m.

The Easter / Holy Pascha Sunday Services will begin with Orthros at 9:45 a.m. followed by the Resurrection Service at 10:00 a.m. The Divine Liturgy will start promptly at 10:30 a.m. Following the services, a coffee hour will take place in the church hall. General Assembly Meeting

A General Assembly Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, June 22 at 11:30 a.m. in order to discuss future services and other matters of business. A prayer service will precede the meeting at 11:00 a.m. As stated earlier there is a shortage of Greek Orthodox priests in the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America and Canada. Other alternatives will be explored later in the spring and will be discussed at the General Assembly Meeting. The financial statement for the year 2024 will be reviewed, and you are very much encouraged to participate at this meeting.

Paschaltide

We say the Paschal Greeting, "Christ is Risen" (Greek: "Christós Anésti") from Pascha (Easter Sunday) until the day before the Ascension of Christ. This season is called the "Paschaltide" and lasts 40 days.

Parish House Renovations

The interior ceiling in the garage suffered water damage prior to the repairs of the exterior garage roof and now needs fixing. The roof above the house or attic also should be replaced. It has reached its maximum usefulness and is deteriorating. It was last replaced in the year 2000, and it was covered over with new shingles which significantly reduced costs at that time. Lastly, the hot water heater in the Parish House needs to be replaced. At least 30 years have past since a new hot water heater was installed. Estimates are being sought for these repair projects and will be presented in the next newsletters.

Saint Mary of Egypt Feast Days: Saturday, March 30 & The Fifth Sunday of Great Lent, Sunday, April 6

Saint Mary of Egypt was an Egyptian grazer saint dwelling in Palestine in the Early Middle Ages. She is highly venerated as Desert Mother in the Eastern Orthodox and Coptic Churches as well as the Roman Catholic Church. She was born in the year 344 and died about 422. She was a prostitute for many years and then received the Holy Eucharist; thereafter, she chose life as a hermit. At one time she was a great sinner and then became a pure and righteous woman. Her sins were confessed and without excuses she found a new life. Her past life became non-existent and her sins were forgiven. Saint Mary of Egypt had repented most of her life and was a desert ascetic. When she reposed, she entered heaven with the pure and the righteous.



Rain Gutters

On Thursday evening, February 27, a neighbor had reported that rain gutters on the left southeast side of the church building had fallen to the ground. It had pulled away all of the aluminum and wood which was at the roof line of the church. The aluminum and wood were immediately replaced so that birds and squirrels were prevented from entering the attic of the church. The cost for these repairs were \$480.00 and were completed by Chris Warner of Watertown. New rain gutters will be replaced in either the spring or summer. The damaged gutters are not repairable. We were fortunate that there was no damage to the sanctuary or basement windows. Below are some pictures of the fallen rain gutters and the roof line. These photographs were taken by Ali Jassem.



Church Boiler

The church boiler which is located in a room at the rear of the basement is not producing enough heat in the sanctuary. The registers have to be drained daily in order to allow for some flow of heat from the boiler. A representative from Fletcher's Contracting, Watertown, examined the boiler and indicated that most likely it will need a replacement before the next heating season. The boiler was installed over 50 years ago and it operates on hot water. Estimates will be sought in order that a suitable replacement is decided upon by the Parish Council.

Yard Clean-Up

It was a fong hard winter which began Thanksgiving Weekend. It did allow for much time to complete some last minute yard clean-up details around the church and parish house. Therefore on Saturday, April 26 at 10:00 a.m. until noon, volunteers are needed to assist with some outdoor maintenance duties. Please bring a rake and a pair of gloves and dress according to the weather conditions. Brown paper leaf bags will be supplied to the volunteers. The Rain date will be on Saturday, May 2 beginning and ending at the same times. Thank you in advance.

Shawn M. Baker of Watertown, New York died unexpectedly at his home on Sunday, February 23. He was 72 years old. Shawn is survived by his wife JoAnn Carlos Baker and children, Kelly (Dan) Daugherty and Kyle (Santina) Baker of Watertown and his sister, Claudia (Roger) Draper also of Watertown and their three children. He is also survived by five grandchildren. He was born on February 16, 1953 and was the son of the late Kenneth and Wilma Baker. He was married at Saint Vasilios Greek Orthodox Church on June 23, 1979.

Shawn began teaching physical education in 1975 at the Union Academy at Belleville. He was the K-12 building principal for the combined Belleville Henderson Central School District. He was a school administrator for 32 years. For many years, Shawn coached baseball and soccer leaving a lasting impression on many students and parents. Shawn volunteered and help organized the Immaculate Heart Central (IHC) Booster Club Golf Tournament and served on the IHC Hall of Fame Committee.

He volunteered at the Salvation Army Old Newsboys Days, was a member of the Sons of the American Legion Post 61, the Italian American Civic Association, a member of the Watertown Catechetical Board, and a communicant and usher at Holy Family Church. He was the proud president of the Moore Avenue Drive Association.
